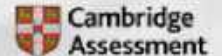

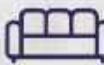

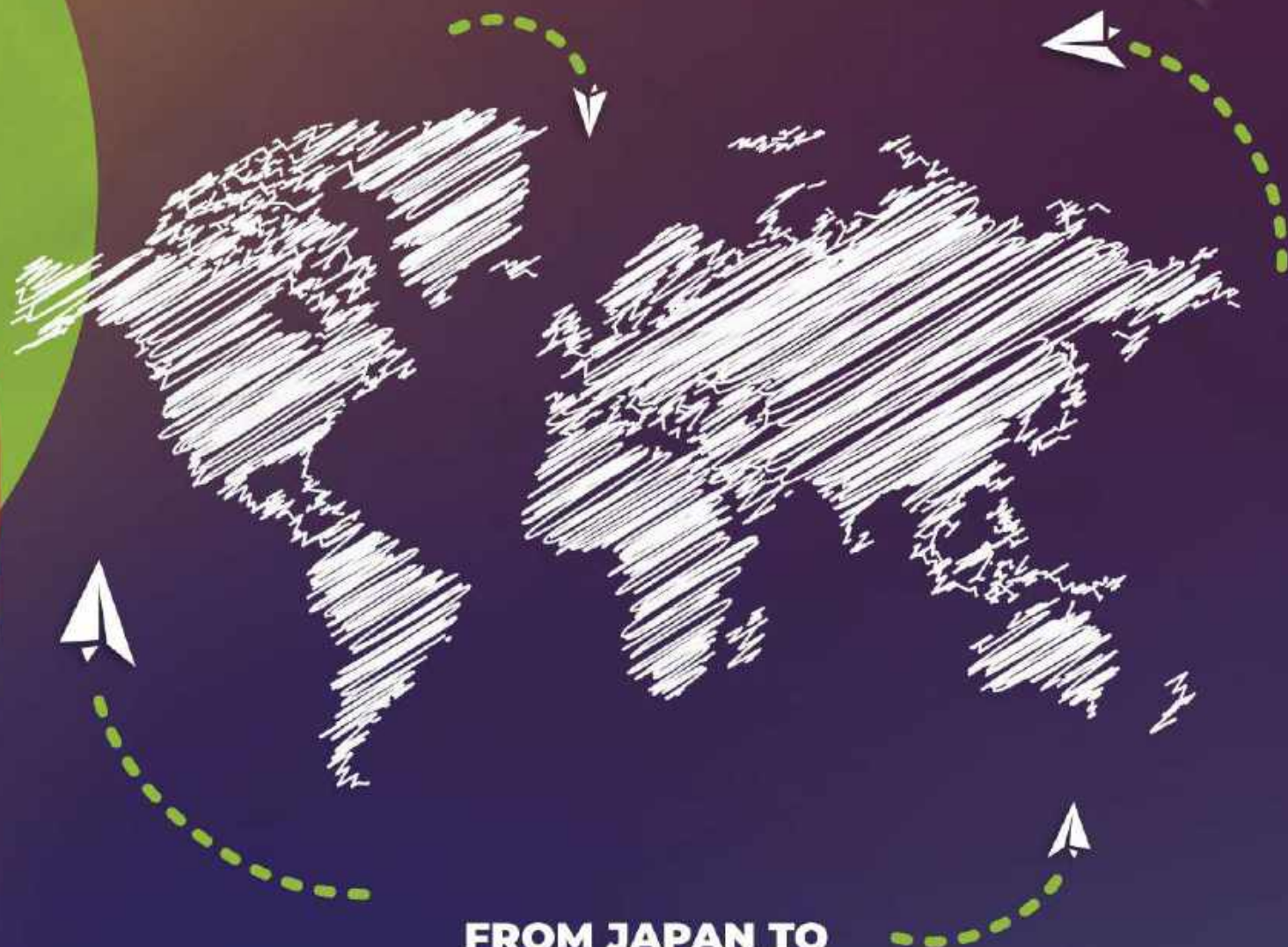

ACADEMIC YEAR PROGRAMME (25 WEEKS' TUITION + 8 WEEKS' HOLIDAY)

The Academic Year Programme is specifically designed for Non EU/EEA students who wish to follow a 25-week full-time programme in English. Students are allowed to stay in Ireland for an 8-month period, may work part-time for up to 20 hours per week during their studies and take the opportunity to travel and work in Ireland during their holiday period.

REQUIREMENTS

STUDENTS NEED TO REGISTER AND TAKE RECOGNIZED EXAMS (E.G., TIE, CAMBRIDGE, IELTS). BEFORE GNIB REGISTRATION, PAY THE EXAM FEE TO THE SCHOOL FOR LATER USE. WHEN GNIB REGISTRATION OPENS, THE SCHOOL WILL REGISTER STUDENTS FOR THE EXAM. VALID MEDICAL INSURANCE IS REQUIRED; STUDENTS CAN GET ACCEPTED COVERAGE THROUGH LLC FOR GNIB (IRP) APPROVAL.

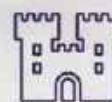

ACCOMMODATION

WE HAVE THREE OPTIONS FOR YOUR STAY IN LIMERICK: A STUDENT APARTMENT, A HOST FAMILY, OR A CITY HOST. SPENDING A FEW WEEKS WITH A HOST FAMILY OR CITY HOST IS THE BEST INTRODUCTION TO IRELAND. THEY WILL MAKE YOU FEEL WELCOME IN THEIR HOME, PROVIDING YOU WITH AN OPPORTUNITY TO PRACTICE ENGLISH THROUGHOUT YOUR STAY. MOST HOSTS LIVE IN THE SUBURBS OF LIMERICK, JUST A 10MIN TO 20MIN BUS RIDE OR A 20MIN TO 40MIN WALK FROM THE CITY CENTRE AND SCHOOL.

IF YOU PREFER MORE INDEPENDENT LIVING, WE ALSO OFFER STUDENT APARTMENTS AT GROVE ISLAND. IT'S A STUDENT VILLAGE THAT ACCOMMODATES STUDENTS IN FOUR AND FIVE-BEDROOM APARTMENTS.

HOST FAMILY ACCOMMODATION INCLUDES:

- Laundry facilities
- A comfortable bedroom, cleaned weekly
- A desk in the room or a quiet area elsewhere in the house to study
- Access to a shower or bath once a day and towels
- Wi-Fi or internet access



CITY HOST ACCOMMODATION INCLUDES:

- Self-catering
- Single or shared room as required (shared bathroom)
- Shared living facilities with the owner
- Laundry facilities | Bed linen is provided (towels not included)
- A desk in the room or a quiet area elsewhere in the house to study
- Wi-Fi or internet access



STUDENT APARTMENT INCLUDES:

- Single en-suite bedroom with a desk (bedroom including shower & toilet)
- Fully-equipped kitchen for self-catering
- Access to laundry facilities in Student Village (small fee per use)
- Bed linen is provided (but not towels or toiletries)
- Electricity, Wi-Fi, water and waste disposal included in price
- Wi-Fi or Internet access

COURSE BOOK POLICY

Students are responsible for purchasing their books.

RETURNING BOOKS

Books can be returned to Shaz, the Operations Manager (go to the reception: second floor).

TAKE CARE OF THE BOOKS

When returning a book, students can receive a refund of up to €20, provided the book is in good condition and free from any damage or markings. Please note that if these conditions are not met, the refund will not be processed.



ASSESSMENT

Students are continuously assessed and tested throughout their study programme. Progress tests take place at the end of a four-week period and students are also assessed as they process daily activities.

PUNCTUALITY & CODE OF CONDUCT

We are here to maximise your learning. Students should take a responsible attitude to learning and attend all classes on time. Students should speak English only throughout the school building, and always bring a pen and paper to class. Disrespectful behaviour to classmates and teaching staff is not acceptable. We follow up on any repeated absence or lateness or disrespectful behaviour.



REQUEST FOR CHANGE OF LEVEL

The Academic Manager will:

- Check your placement score and progress test results
- Discuss a change of level request with your teacher
- Arrange an interview with a teacher from the next level
- Use all of the above information to make a change of level decision

If you feel that you are in a class at the wrong level, please speak to the Academic Director.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

HOW TO GET STUDENT CARD

We recommend the Child Leap card (age 16-18), Young Adult Leap card (age 19-23) or Student Leap Card (24+) for discounted national and local travel and the ISIC card for shopping discounts and for international proof of student status.

WHAT ARE THE ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA?

Since the 9th of May 2022, all 24-year-old and over in full-time third level education, including further education and training, have been entitled to apply for the Student Leap Card (SLC). Students must have a minimum of 16 hours of lectures/class time per week, and be enrolled in the course for a minimum of 6 months. Full-time foreign students who meet the above criteria are also entitled to apply for the SLC whilst in Ireland.



LEAP CARD

This card gives the Young Adult/Student fare on public transport services, including: Bus Éireann, TFI Local Link and Irish Rail.



ISIC CARD

An official student ID for students in secondary and third level education. Be recognised as a student and get access to student discounts.
